Improving Student Attendance We are off to a great start with student attendance. In September the average daily attendance for all students was 95%. The class with the best attendance was 3A, and their average daily attendance was 98%. They had a little reward and lots of praise! Remember, even missing 1 day a month means dropping to 95% attendance. What can you do to help?

- Build regular routines for bedtime and the morning.
- Set out clothes pack backpacks, and lunches the night before to give extra time in the morning.
- If there is a reason that they aren't looking forward to school regularly, please reach out and let us know so we can address it,
- Schedule medical appointments after dismissal if possible

Make Time for Crafts Schools have noticed a decline in children's fine motor skills. One easy way you can support your child at home is through arts and crafts. Children love to be creative, but it's so much more than that.

• When kids use their fingers to manipulate art materials they are developing their fine motor skills as they use

those small muscles in their hands. Their bilateral coordination skills improve as they learn to use both hands at the same time.

- Early child literacy skills in art and crafts cover a wide range of areas. When kids make art or crafts they get to talk about their work which develops their communication skills. "Why did you choose that colour?" "Tell me about what you made."
- Kids get to learn about and recognize different shapes, count and sort out their art supplies and even measure out lengths and sizes of art materials.
- Don't worry so much about the finished project. Focus more on all of these amazing skills
- · So, get out those scissors and glue and let your child develop their inner artists and so much more!

<u>Student Sign Out:</u> If you are picking your child up early from school after you have been greeted by a staff member we ask you to please come up to the top of the stairs and sign your child out.

School entry: The back door will remain locked during the day. All visitors must enter through the main door. We ask you to please ring the doorbell on the right hand side and wait until a staff member greets you. Visitors are asked to sign in at the table at the top of the stairs.

Safety Issues: Confederation Street - Concern has been expressed in the past over student safety. We ask for your cooperation in dropping off and picking up students on the school side of Confederation Street only. Please do not drive into the staff parking lot to drop off students. Parents dropping their children off in the morning, please remember that supervision begins at 8:15 am and the bell rings at 8:25 am for school to start. Students can be dropped in the back pavement area and our greeters will welcome them. Parents are asked to say goodbyes at the doors.

<u>Dismissal</u>: Parents picking their children up at the end of the day can meet them outside the front door. Students are dismissed at 2:30 pm. Students **SHOULD NOT** be by themselves crossing the road to get into parent vehicles.

Change in After School Routine

If there is a change in their regular after school routine, we require an <u>email to the teacher and Jackie in the office or a phone call prior to noon.</u> If we do not receive notification from you, your child will follow their regular routine.

PSB Text Messaging System

Parents are invited to join our emergency text messaging system. The system is configured to send text messages to mobile phone numbers whose recipients have agreed to receive them. We use text messages to communicate during emergency situations as well as specific school closures or early dismissals. Parents can easily opt-in by texting "Y" (or "Yes") to our Short Code number 978338 (Canadian-based numbers) or 61569 (US-based numbers). Standard Text Message & Data rates may apply.

Social Emotional Learning

The single most important thing you can do to help calm your child when they are upset is to remain calm. When a child is upset and adults around them begin to get upset as well, it often leads to raised voices, threats of unrelated consequences if they do not calm, taking away preferred activities or possessions, etc. Two key things occur when this happens; first, the heightened state of the adult leads to even more heightened state of the child, due to coregulation. The second, is that the child learns from the adult that it is appropriate to raise their voice and punish other people when they are upset. We need to bring the calm when our children are upset. Model taking deep breaths, stating your feelings out loud in a calm voice, "I'm upset and I need to calm my body by taking deep breaths and slowing down my heartbeat." Children learn far more from what we do than from what we say.
