Social Emotional Learning

Sometimes it is not what we say, but how we say it.

Tone of voice can carry a lot of meaning and it can cause hurt and confusion for younger children. This is especially the case when a parent uses sarcasm and it is misunderstood by the child.

Sarcasm can lead to hurt feelings and misunderstandings that are better avoided. The best policy is to speak to children in the way you want them to speak to you and to others. Children have developing brains that are learning how to be in the world. How they are treated, how others act toward them – especially caregivers – is how they are likely to learn to act and to speak. Children are more likely to complete a request if it is presented kindly rather than as a demand or an order. If you speak to your child in a kind and caring rather than in a critical manner they are more likely to develop a positive inner voice to lead their thoughts. This will help them develop a healthy self-esteem and to speak to themselves with the same kindness and to bestow that same kindness onto others.
